
**Resolution on Equitable Parking Access, Parking Fees and Designated
Parking Areas among Students, Faculty, and Staff**

1. **WHEREAS:** The Associated Students, Inc., is the representative body and the official voice of the students at California State University, Stanislaus; and
2. **WHEREAS:** The high cost of student parking passes as well as the limited and often inconvenient locations designated for student parking, have long been a complaint of many students, particularly when compared to the parking costs paid by and the designated parking locations made available to faculty and staff; and
3. **WHEREAS:** For the 2018-19 school year, faculty members paid only \$52.00 for a fall parking permit and \$55.00 for a spring permit; and
4. **WHEREAS:** For the 2018-19 school year, Staff-Confidential employees (covered under Bargaining Units 2, 5, 7 and 9) paid only \$60.00 for permits for each fall and spring semesters; and
5. **WHEREAS:** For the 2018-19 school year, student parking permits cost \$184.83 for each fall and spring semester, or over 300% more than faculty and staff pay; and
6. **WHEREAS:** Due to the long-standing dissatisfaction voiced by students over parking-related issues, the Associated Students, Inc., Board of Directors, held an open forum to allow students to discuss their specific concerns and to make suggestions for improvement as related to the campus parking situation; and
7. **WHEREAS:** During an open forum event, held on February 12, 2019, students made several suggestions, including the following:
 - 1) Provide more information and create better marketing for the various parking options and services available on campus, such as:

- Economy and Evening Parking Permits
 - Evening Student Safety Shuttles to/from parking lots
 - Motorist Calls for Service (jump starts, unlock services, etc.)
 - Emergency Blue Light Phone Stations
- 2) Use the revenue received from parking permits and parking fines to develop and/or enhance alternative transportation methods, such as:
- Bike Share Program
 - Turlock Transit and Other Local Bus Transportation
 - Carpooling, etc.
- 3) To address safety concerns in Lot 11A (the gravel parking lot), provide temporary lighting at this location.

8. **RESOLVED:** To take immediate steps to institute the suggestions of the students (as listed above) through re-activation and active involvement of a campus parking committee, which includes at least three (3) student representatives; and
9. **RESOLVED:** Create a more fair and equitable parking among students, faculty and staff by removing all faculty and staff designated parking; and
10. **RESOLVED:** Contribute a minimum of 10% of the revenue received from parking permits and parking fines towards Turlock Transit and/or a bike share program.
11. **RESOLVED:** Request that California State Student Association solicit the assistance of the Chancellor's Office in addressing the inequitable costs of parking permits for students as compared to what faculty and staff pay.
12. **RESOLVED:** that copies of this resolution be distributed to the President of Stanislaus State, Ellen Junn, Vice President of Business and Finance, Darrell Haydon, Vice President of Student Affairs, Christine Erickson, Chief of Police, Clint Strode, Associate Vice President of Capital Planning and Facilities Management, Melody Maffei, and the President of the California State Student Association, Mia Kagianas.


