

# Use of Funds

## PURPOSE

In accordance with policies established by the California State University the following policy applies to the use of mandatory student fees collected by the CSUS Associated Students, Inc. The sections noted below are form the CSU policy on use of auxiliary funds and meet all criteria identified in sections 89300 and 89302 of the California Education Code and sections 42500 and 42569 of Title V.

**Section 15.8.1** The principle underlying the expenditure of [CSUS Associated Students, Inc.] student body organization funds collected through mandatory student fees is that such expenditures shall be made in programs that reflect the broadest variety of student interests and that are open to all students who wish to participate.

## POLICY

Mandatory fees that are collected by the Associated Students, Incorporated of California State University, Stanislaus, must be used in a variety of ways and used in the best interest of the entire student body. All events and/or programs funded by the mandatory student fees must be open to all students.

## **PROCEDURE**

- 1.0 Associated Students, Inc. funds may be expended for the following purposes:
  - 1.1 Programs of cultural and educational enrichment and community service.
  - 1.2 Recreational and social activities.
  - 1.3 Support of student unions.
  - 1.4 Scholarships, stipends, and grants-in-aid for only currently admitted students in accordance with provisions of Section 42500, subdivision (d).
  - 1.5 Tutorial programs.
  - 1.6 Athletic programs, both intramural and intercollegiate.
  - 1.7 Student publications.
  - 1.8 Assistance to recognized student organizations.
  - 1.9 Student travel insurance.
  - 1.10 Administration of student fee program.
  - 1.11 Student government-scholarship stipends, grants-in-aid, and reimbursements to student officers for service to student government. Before such scholarship stipends, grants-in-aid, and reimbursements are established by a student body association, the principle of establishing such payments shall be approved by a student referendum.
  - 1.12 Student employment to provide payment for services in connection with the general administration of student fee.
  - 1.13 Augmentation of counseling services, including draft information, to be performed by the campus. Such counseling may also include counseling on legal matters to the extent of helping the student to determine whether he should retain legal counsel, and of referring him to legal counsel through a bar association, legal aid foundation or similar body.
  - 1.14 Transportation services.
  - 1.15 Child day care centers for children of students and employees of campus.
  - 1.16 Augmentation of campus health services.
